From the **Superintendent**

We are moving through another school year heading into the spring hopeful for a break from the bad weather and the winter doldrums! We have so much to be proud of each year due

to the accomplishments of our students, and this year is no exception. Each year the students amaze us with their academic, co-curricular and servicerelated achievements. This outstanding accomplishment is the direct result of the utilization of educational best practices, a collaborative learning culture where "Kids Come First," and the support and guidance from great families.

We continue to earn accolades from various organizations for our student achievement. This past fall the Ohio Department of Education bestowed their highest honor on our district designating it as an "A" rated district! Only 28 of the 611 public districts in Ohio earned this distinction. We also received the Momentum Award from ODE signifying our students earned straight A's on all value added, or progress measures. We were one of only a handful of districts in the state to earn both of these prestigious awards.

AHS EARNS ODE 2018 MOMENTUM AND OVERALL "A" AWARDS

of growth and not overall achievement, making this award much more difficult to attain. The award recognizes schools for earning

Ohio State Board of Education President Tess Elshoff stated in a letter to the district,"I'm pleased to let you know Ohio's State Board of Education has granted your district a 2017-2018 Momentum Award. Now in its fourth year, the Momentum Award is the State Board's way of recognizing districts that received A's on every Value-Added measure included on Ohio's school and district report cards. As a Momentum Award winner, your district's report card shows your district is committed to its students' success by ensuring students

generates approximately \$777,000 yearly for the district and means the owner of a \$100,000 home currently pays \$31.81 per year. This \$31.81 per year amount would remain the same with levy passage.

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Permanent improvement levy funds can only be used by a district to renovate, remodel, and purchase equipment for capital improvement projects that have a life span of 5 years or more. This would generally include such projects as roads, school buses, roofing, HVAC, etc. Permanent improvement levy monies cannot, by law, be used to pay salaries or benefits. The district would like to remind voters to please cast your ballot on May 7, 2019.

ON MAY 2019 BALLOT City of Aurora voters will see an Aurora City School District levy on the May 7, 2019 primary election ballot. The levy is a renewal of a 1.5 mill existing general permanent improvement levy.

This renewal levy means that the funds generated from this levy WILL NOT **INCREASE TAXES** if passed by voters. Passage only continues the current permanent improvement levy which

exceeded the growth expectations in English language arts and mathematics. I also congratulate you on recruiting and motivating the high-quality leaders and staff needed to make this happen."



Aurora High School Principal, Paul Milcetich explained, "Recently, we received some very positive news from the Ohio Department of

Education (ODE) that Aurora High School received both the 2018 Ohio School Momentum Award (3 years running), as well as the Overall A School Award (1st year of this award). The Momentum Award includes schools that have A's in Value Added in Math and Reading in at least two subgroups: we have A's for Overall, Special Education, and Gifted, meaning exceeding growth expectations in all of these areas. The Overall A School Award includes schools with an overall "A" on the Ohio Report Card. These indicators show how effective our learning environment is in reaching all levels of students at Aurora High School."

Milcetich added, "After some analysis, I am proud to share that only 12 high schools in Ohio (of 1,152 public high schools, so 1%), earned both the Momentum Award, as well as the Overall A Award, with seven of those in Northeast Ohio! Beachwood, Brecksville-Broadview Heights, Chagrin Falls, Kenston, Rocky River, and Solon Schools are the other area schools with the rest scattered around the state. We certainly are in great company, and these results show the quality of public schools in our area! Congratulations to our students, staff, parents, and community. This type of recognition does not occur without plenty of talent, hard work, and a commitment to excellence all coming together. We are fortunate to have outstanding students, a committed staff, and supportive parents. Given this combination along with our excellent programs in academics, athletics, the arts, and our activities, our students have amazing opportunities to shine in so many ways with these awards being just one example."



variety of observations, audits, inspections, etc., once again earned the school the highest rating of 5 STARS from the **OHIO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION**.






NHS AURORA FOR OTHERS
